Learning target

Explain that environments can influence how traits develop.



Before you begin

Use the reference page and discussion prompts on their own, or open the optional browser adventure. No earlier lesson or physical kit is required.

Growth conditions; nutrition; light and water for plants; both inheritance and environment

Environment & Trait Expression - key ideas

1. The first clues

Both inheritance and environment can influence traits. Water, light and nutrition can affect plant growth.

2. How the clues connect

To investigate an environmental influence, compare similar plants under controlled conditions. Changing many conditions at once makes the cause harder to identify.

3. Our evidence record

Our same-kind seedlings receive equal light and temperature but different water amounts. Different growth supports a water influence in this test, without proving inheritance is irrelevant.

Keep the science accurate

Use plants and fictional animal records, not sensitive student family comparisons. No Punnett squares, simple eye-color inheritance rules or genetic determinism.

Apply the evidence

Use a specific observation from this lesson to explain one choice. Point to a clue, then connect that clue to a scientific idea.

Talk through the evidence

1. Which condition differs in our test?

Expected answer: Water amount

Reasoning: To investigate an environmental influence, compare similar plants under controlled conditions. Changing many conditions at once makes the cause harder to identify.

2. Can environment influence growth?

Expected answer: Yes

Reasoning: Both inheritance and environment can influence traits. Water, light and nutrition can affect plant growth.

3. Why keep light and temperature alike?

Expected answer: To make the water comparison clearer

Reasoning: Both inheritance and environment can influence traits. Water, light and nutrition can affect plant growth.

4. Which conclusion is justified?

Expected answer: Water affected growth in this comparison

Reasoning: Both inheritance and environment can influence traits. Water, light and nutrition can affect plant growth.

Guide the discussion

Ask learners to name the evidence that supports their answer. If an answer differs, revisit the matching key idea on page 2 and invite a revised explanation.
